World Science Day for Peace and Development is celebrated internationally to highlight the importance of science in and for society and that science, peace and development are interlinked.

Science centres and museums provide effective platforms to societies to create and share scientific knowledge, to nurture it as source of innovation and creativity, and to help develop a more inclusive, sustainable and just path to the future. They also play key roles in sparking the curiosity in children and adults, and help create awareness about science and its role for sustainable development. In the digital era, when we need innovative initiatives to promote the learning of science outside the classrooms, museums and science centres are active nurseries for science education. They motivate and encourage school children to pursue careers in science.
