


# OVERVIEW





- Need for a response to government call for partnership to implement the recommendations of TRRC
- > UNDP is already supporting this initiative
- > The Initial disbursement of funds have been made vale of USD100,000
- The objective is facilitate training and policy level advice to stakeholders involved in transitional justice and sustainable peace
- > To Establish the Centre as a regional thought leader in TJ&SP
- To conduct research and offer policy advice to government, other partners and countries in the African region through perception study on TRRC and Graduate scheme for the Justice Sector in The Gambia
